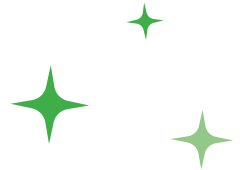




COMMUNITY CARE FOUNDATION



In 2024, Delta Dental and the Community Care Foundation granted **\$225,000** within the state of **Montana**.

Since 2011, the Foundation has dedicated more than \$176 million to improving oral health across its enterprise, spanning 15 states and Washington, D.C. By investing in the four focus areas outlined below, the Foundation is helping to ensure that everyone, regardless of their background or location, has access to quality oral health care.

Access to Care Grants

Fund organizations working to increase access to care, address health disparities, drive oral health equity and promote innovation in the oral health field.

Senior Oral Health Program

A multi-year initiative to identify, assess and address the socioeconomic and systemic causes of poor oral health among older adults.

Education & Research Grants

Support our partnerships with universities to increase inclusiveness in the education and development of future dental professionals.

Community Investments

Focus on supporting local organizations through health equity, social justice and disaster relief efforts.
